ROUND AND ROUND

This is not an April Fool's joke—Related is working toward starting construction on the roundabout in mid-April 2016. The start could be as soon as April 11 but will more likely be the week following. As we understand it, they are finalizing a contract with Gould Construction, a very reputable local company, to undertake this significant project. Early next week Gould will be putting up an electronic message board signs alerting drivers of the upcoming construction project. Pamphlets will be mailed out next week to all of the PO Boxes in the Village with the expected timeline of the project. A number of press releases and other public information sources will also be produced. In order to move dirt, Related still needs to deliver performance bond guarantees, a couple of easements and some other administrative requirements. As the Council is aware, in both the October 2014 PUD approval and the December 2015 conditional PUD approval, Related is required to deliver a substantially complete roundabout by November 1 of this year. So even without the all of the 2016 Base Village agreements being reviewed and executed they have found it in their best interest to get this construction project underway so that they can meet this deadline. Finally, although the mini-round about at the intersection of Carriage Way and Wood Road is not required to be delivered until the summer of 2017, we understand they are going to attempt to complete that part of the project prior to November 1, 2016 as well. Feel free to go ahead and start crossing your fingers and toes.

TID BITS:

The Public Works Department received big props from the Part-Time Residents Advisory Board this week. The PTRAB couldn't say enough positive things about the road conditions around the Village. As I understand it, the observation was made that the roads in Town are "noticeably better" than around the County and City of Aspen.

- With Snowmass Mountain closing on April 10 Public Works and Transportation will be going back to our "non-ski season" schedule which means more standard hours during the day. The increased summer bus schedule will start June 3.
- Village retailers and restaurants are encouraged to participate in the upcoming Spring Fling closing celebration on April 9. This goes without saying, but all of the cool kids will be there.
- We are still collecting numbers for February, but to date it appears that the paid occupancy rate in the Village was actually higher than Aspen.
- Keep your eyes open this summer for a new American Airlines flight from Aspen to LAX. Apparently the starting rate is going to be around \$250.

- We are continuing to make some progress on the uphill bike trail that will greatly improve the riding on Fanny Hill and the rest of the mountain for folks that don't want to use the lifts to go up. The design for the trail is largely complete and we are now working with SkiCo and other property owners to put appropriate easements in place.
- The Recreation Center will be closed April 13-17 for some significant Spring Cleaning; including redoing the gym floors, deep cleaning the pool and other necessary projects that are nearly impossible to undertake when patrons are there. More detailed information is attached.
- Planning ahead, on September 9, a contingent of 70 community leaders from Park City Utah will be in Snowmass Village from about 9 to noon to learn from us what we do well. In addition to the Village, the contingent from Park City will also be visiting communities from Carbondale to Aspen.
