

Snowmass Bike Rack Proposal: One

I have lived as an artist in the Roaring Fork Valley since 1995. I have seen the town of Snowmass grow and change, but one thing that has stayed the same is that Snowmass is a fun and adventurous place for families and individuals.

This belief is the basis for my proposals. I want to create bike racks that are fun, bright, energetic and functional sculptures that reflect the favorite activities and energy of the Snowmass area. In my first proposal, I want to create line drawn figurative sculptures derived from sign symbols portraying these activities.

The figurative sculptures would be constructed of 1 5/8 inch steel pipe. The steel pipe will be heated, bent, cut and welded to form the sculptural bike racks. The sculptures will be cleaned, sand blasted and painted. The industrial paint that will be used will be rubberized paint applied professionally. This paint is often used in outdoor public play structures and is very durable and holds up to harsh weather and abuse.

The presented images shown are a snow boarder doing a box slide, a hiker and a bicyclist. Each sculpture can hold four bikes. Other imagery I would like to use would be, a skier, a fisherman, a snowflake and a mammoth. The scale of the figures would be life size. The art can be welded on a steel plate that that can be screwed into the concrete or brick, finished the same as the rest of the piece; or steel posts could be added to the base that could be cemented in place. The cost of each bike rack would be \$4000, which includes design, materials, fabrication, finish work, painting and delivery.
