

Snowmass Bike Rack proposal 2

I have lived as an artist in the Roaring Fork Valley since 1995. I have seen the town of Snowmass Village grow and change, but one thing that has stayed the same is that Snowmass is a fun and adventurous place for families and individuals.

This belief is the basis for my proposals. I want to create bike racks that are fun, bright, energetic, functional sculptures that reflect the favorite activities and energy of the Snowmass area. If chosen; in my second proposal I want to create painted steel spirals to park bikes in with fun characters that reflect these activities.

These whimsical spirals would be constructed of 1 5/8 inch steel pipe. The spiraling bike rack would have a larger higher spiral at one end that would take the form of a hill or mountain. Welded to the higher spiral, would be steel cut out figures, created by me, depicting Snowmass's favorite activities; like biking (shown in image). Other imagery could be a family of skiers, snowboarders, mammoths, and musicians, etc. The spirals would be sand blasted and painted with a professionally applied rubberized paint. This paint is used in out door public play structures and is very durable and holds up to harsh weather and abuse. The figures would be cut from quarter inch plate steel, welded firmly to the spirals, sand blasted and hand painted with epoxy paints. The structure can be welded to a steel plate finished the same as the rest of the piece and screwed into the concrete or brick. The cost of each bike rack sculpture would be \$4000; which includes design, materials, fabrication, finish work, painting and delivery.
