Boards of Appeals & Examiners

Purpose	The Board of Appeals and Examiners assists and advises the building official in reviewing applications for contractor's licenses, the suspension or revocation of contractor's licenses, and the procedures for conducting examinations and investigations concerning contractor's licenses.

Citizens Grant Review Board

Purpose	The Citizen's Grant Review Board manages the process for which non-profits in the Roaring Fork Valley can apply to the town for grant funding. They evaluate applications and award grants in a manner that serves the best interests of the Snowmass Village community.

Purpose	The Environmental Advisory Board is a collaborative group committed to updating and accomplishing the goals of the town's Environmental Sustainability Plan. The Board provides technical expertise and a broad community perspective in order to develop recommendations concerning projects, programs, policies, and operational practices that benefit the natural environment, the local economy, and community.

Meetings	The Board typically meets on the first Tuesday of each month at Town Hall.

Financial Advisory Board

Purpose	The Financial Advisory Board makes recommendations to the Town Council prior to the adoption of the budget and capital program for the town and renders additional recommendations or advice at the council's request. All Financial Advisory Board members have backgrounds and/or education in business or public finance, accounting, or budgeting

Meetings	The board meets as needed, but typically no less than quarterly. Extra meetings are usually scheduled to review the annual budget.

Purpose	The Marketing, Group Sales, and Special Events Board was created to develop tourism for the benefit of the Snowmass Village economy. Parks, Open Space, Trails, & Recreation (POSTR) Board

Purpose	The POSTR Advisory Board was established to provide knowledge and to guide, review, and make recommendations to the Town Council on issues and policies consistent with the POSTR Master Plan (PDF). They are also relied upon as a mechanism for education and communication regarding the Town's parks and recreation assets.

Part-Time Resident Advisory Board

Purpose	The Part-Time Residents Advisory Board (PTRAB) provides a mechanism of communication and education between part-time residents and the Town Council. Part-time residents are owners of property in Snowmass Village who are not registered voters in the Village.
